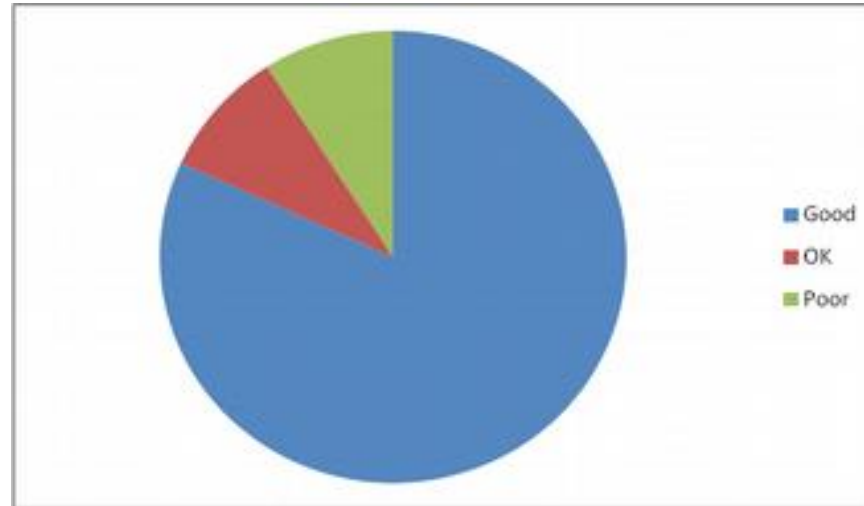


Review – The Others
